



**Maple Scribe SOAP Note – DEMO**

**SUBJECTIVE:**

Chief complaint: Congestion and left shoulder pain.

- Patient reports congestion started 3 days ago, initially mild but progressing with sore throat and sinus pressure. No fever or chills. Shoulder pain occurs when lifting arm above a certain point, possibly due to overuse from weightlifting and shoveling.

**OBJECTIVE:**

Vitals not mentioned.

- Bilateral otitis media with effusion (fluid behind left ear)
- Throat examination: normal
- Lymph nodes in neck: no swelling
- Lung examination: clear
- Shoulder examination: positive empty can sign, positive Hawkins test; full range of motion but pain after 90 degrees abduction

**ASSESSMENT:**

1. Common cold
2. Rotator cuff tendonitis (left shoulder)

**PLAN:**

- Tylenol or Advil as needed for congestion and pain
- Follow-up in 2-3 weeks if symptoms persist or worsen
- Physiotherapy for left shoulder tendonitis
- Ultrasound of left shoulder if no progress with physiotherapy
- Consider steroid injection if imaging is pursued
